Purpose of this Notice

The Department of Natural Resources Division of Law Enforcement is committed to protecting your privacy. This notice explains our general privacy practices and how we handle your personal data. We may provide more specific notices on forms or other webpages where we collect your data.

What We Collect and Why

We only collect personal data as allowed by law and to fulfill our core mission of managing Utah's natural resources. We may collect information from you when you visit our website, apply for a permit, or interact with us. We manage our data per the record series detailed here. Depending on the service you're using, this information may include:

- **Names and Contact Information:** First and last names, mailing addresses, email addresses, and phone numbers.
- **Identification Numbers:** Account numbers, or other unique identifiers.
- **Financial Information:** Credit/debit card numbers for payments and transaction histories.
- **License Information:** Details related to applications or permits
- **Employment Information:** Data related to job or volunteer applications.

How We Collect Website Tracking Data

Like most websites, we use tracking technology to improve your experience and to help us understand how people use our site. We use tools like Google Analytics to collect digital information, such as your IP address, browser type, and the pages you visit. This data is used to analyze website traffic, troubleshoot technical issues, and enhance our services.

Protection of Personal Data

We work hard to protect your personal data through technical and administrative safeguards. Our employees are trained on privacy and security policies, and we require our service providers to protect your data. If a data breach occurs, we will notify you as required by law.

We do not sell your personal data.

Sharing Personal Data

We only share personal data when allowed by law. We may share data with service providers and partners (like other government agencies) who are obligated to protect your data. We may also share data if legally required to do so.

Your Privacy Rights

Under Utah law, you have the right to:

- **Request access** to records that contain your personal data.
- **Request a correction** if our records contain inaccurate personal data.
- **File a complaint** with the Data Privacy Ombudsperson at PrivacyOmbudsperson@Utah.Gov.
- **For at-risk employees**, request that our records containing your personal data be classified as private.

Department of Natural Resources Law Enforcement Records

The personal data collected by this division is utilized for the investigation of criminal activity, the identification of involved parties, and the fulfillment of administrative and public safety mandates. Providing this information is necessary for the division to perform its duties; consequently, a refusal to provide requested data may result in an inability to process incident reports, delays in administrative services, or non-compliance with statutory reporting requirements. These data sets are officially maintained within Record Series [31384](#) and Record Series [31366](#). This notice is posted pursuant to [Utah Code 63A-19-402\(5\)](#).

To support these public safety objectives, the division may share personal data with authorized classes of persons and governmental entities, including criminal justice agencies, judicial authorities, and regulatory bodies with oversight over law enforcement functions. This information is shared strictly for official purposes, such as ongoing investigations or judicial proceedings; the division does not sell personal data to any private individuals or commercial entities.
