Program aims to provide better understanding of Utah's snowpack



The Utah Division of Water Resources is partnering with Airborne Snow Observatories, Inc. (ASO) on a project to acquire snowpack measurements in the Great Salt Lake Basin. Recently, engineers manually measured snow water equivalent to provide key data

points for ASO. This helps them assess the accuracy of their measurements and make necessary adjustments. The division is excited about this cuttingedge technology and its role in shaping critical water management decisions for the basin. Stay tuned for updates!
