Grant-funded initiatives help reshape the Jordan River landscape



Last fiscal year, the Utah Division of Forestry, Fire and State Lands awarded \$645,000 in grant funding to municipalities and non-profit organizations with a vested interest in the Jordan River. This funding was used to complete projects to improve and preserve the river's health and accessibility. Funding for these

grants is a part of ongoing legislative funding, with part of it coming from the Jordan River Recreation Zone and the Cooperative Weed Management Area funding.

Outdoor recreation in Utah contributes \$8.1 billion to the economy

The U.S. Department of Commerce's Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) has released economic data for 2022 exhibiting outdoor recreation's powerful and positive economic impact on the U.S. economy. The outdoor recreation

economy in Utah grew an impressive 32.8% from 2021 to 2022, according to the BEA Outdoor Recreation Satellite Account. This year's report shows that outdoor recreation creates \$8.1 billion in value-added for Utah, accounts for 3.2% of Utah's GDP and includes 71,677 jobs. This is the largest recorded measure for Utah since the BEA started calculating the size of the outdoor recreation
