DWR, UDOT and other partners complete 5 projects to help wildlife and fish migrate



The Utah Division of Wildlife Resources and Utah Department of Transportation, as well as other partners, are working hard to reduce wildlife/vehicle collisions around the state and to also make it easier for wildlife and fish to make their important annual

migrations. In 2024, the agencies and other partners installed several different structures and completed a few studies to help wildlife and fish migrate safely in various areas throughout Utah.

Smoke mitigation work completed at Kenilworth Coal Mine



A coal seam fire at the reclaimed Kenilworth Mine in Carbon County prompted emergency action in August 2024 due to increased smoke affecting residents in the town of Kenilworth. Contractors sealed surface openings with foam to reduce airflow,

slow the fire, and minimize smoke. While the fire continues to burn underground, visible smoke has stopped. Staff are evaluating long-term options for extinguishing the fire, which may take years. The cause is unknown, but similar fires have been reported at the mine since 1906.

Update on Utah's earthquake early warning efforts



Utah ranks 4th in the U.S. for having severe seismic risk. About 85% of Utah's residents, infrastructure and economy are concentrated within 15 miles of the state's most active fault, the Wasatch fault, making

the Wasatch Front the highest risk area in the state. A recent publication reported that Utah has more than a 50% chance of a large magnitude 6.5 or greater earthquake occurring along the Wasatch Front within the next 50 years.
