Over 168,000 acres restored through Utah's Watershed Restoration Initiative in 2023-24



Resurging interest in Utah's geothermal energy resources



Our location along the eastern boundary of the Great Basin, a physiographic region defined geologically as having abundant geothermal heat close to the Earth's surface, is fortunate for our population since geothermal energy is a renewable, mostly carbon-neutral, domestic resource that can produce electricity 24 hours per

day, seven days per week.

Utah's new Outdoor Recreation Initiative Awards over \$20M to enhance outdoor recreation



The Utah Division of Outdoor Recreation (DOR) recently announced the awarding of more than \$20 million to 31 outdoor recreation projects across the state. The funding, made possible through legislative appropriations and the Outdoor Adventure Infrastructure Fund, marks a significant investment in the state's outdoor amenities, ensuring access, sustainability and enhanced experiences for all Utahns and visitors. The awarded projects include a

variety of initiatives, including new infrastructure development, restoration efforts, land acquisition, feasibility studies and long-term recreation planning. The funding reflects the mission of the Outdoor Recreation Initiative, recently created by the Legislature and overseen by DOR, to champion stewardship, sustainable visitation, safety, education and community engagement across the state.
