Utah drought update



Mother Nature did her part in delivering a hearty helping of snow this winter. Last year 99% of the state was in "severe" drought. Today, none of Utah falls in the "severe" drought category, and just 14% is "moderately dry," and 37% isn't experiencing any drought. With the exception of large lakes and reservoirs like Strawberry, Great Salt Lake and Lake Powell, our reservoirs are expected to fill. Because

reservoirs store water during wet years for use during dry years, intentional, ongoing water conservation — by everyone — is the most impactful tool in the toolbox for ensuring a secure water future.

Division of Outdoor Recreation awards over \$20M in grants



The Utah Division of Outdoor Recreation is awarding over \$20 million in grants to enhance outdoor recreation opportunities throughout Utah – the most to date awarded by the state. The division will award more than \$16 million in Utah Outdoor Recreation

Grant (UORG) funds to 90 outdoor recreation infrastructure <u>projects in 24</u> counties across Utah, and \$4.2 million in Off-Highway Vehicle (OHV)

Recreation grants to 51 OHV-related projects in 28 counties. In addition to infrastructure for water recreation, OHV use, climbing and other recreational activities, this year's grant funding will help restore nearly 800 miles of existing, multi-use trail and help build nearly 150 miles of new, multi-use trails throughout the state. The grants will benefit communities across Utah, from rural areas to urban centers. Since 2015, the Utah Outdoor Recreation Grant has awarded over \$50 million to 489 projects for building or restoring outdoor recreation infrastructure across Utah. The OHV Recreation Grant has funded more than \$10 million to 270 projects since it was created in 2020.


Construction underway to renovate Red Fleet State Park
