Energy heats up in Utah



The Utah Office of Energy Development (OED) has signed several memorandums of understanding (MOUs) that will advance energy projects through research and collaboration. In May, OED signed an

MOU with Idaho National Laboratory (INL) to conduct research on energy technologies and pursue federal funding for projects of mutual interest. An MOU with an industry leader in the nuclear space, HiTech, was also signed in May and will see OED and HiTech collaborate to achieve the goals of Operation Gigawatt. Most recently, OED signed MOUs with Valar Atomics and NuCube to conduct research on nuclear technologies at the Utah San Rafael Energy Lab.

Nearly 11K boats inspected for aquatic invasive species during Memorial Day weekend



Memorial Day weekend often kicks off the summer boating season, and over the weekend, Utah Department of Natural Resources officers, Utah Division of Wildlife Resources technicians and other agency staff were hard at work inspecting and

decontaminating watercraft. The main goal of this effort was to prevent quagga mussels and other aquatic invasive species — including Eurasian watermilfoil — from Lake Powell and from infested reservoirs outside the state from spreading to other waterbodies in Utah.

Utah Receives \$3M for Forest Legacy Project in Washington County

Utah received \$3 million to purchase a conservation easement on two properties through the Forest Legacy Program. The Zion Connectivity Project is on the northeastern border and will preserve 766 acres of forestland.



Utah Division of Outdoor Recreation funds a record-breaking 142 projects



The Division of Outdoor Recreation has awarded a record amount of funding this year to support outdoor recreation projects statewide, with 142 grants approved across all of Utah's 29 counties. This year marks the most projects funded and the most money

awarded in the history of these programs. Through the Utah Outdoor Recreation Grant, Off-Highway Vehicle Recreation Grant, and Recreational Trails Program, the division will distribute more than \$23.2 million to support recreation infrastructure, access and safety statewide.
