Drought Update

The Division of Water Resources continues to monitor drought conditions across the state. Spring runoff is dwindling. Soil moisture is decaying faster than usual this water year, which could mean heightened fire danger this summer. According to the U.S. Drought Monitor, 99% of the state is in severe and extreme drought. Eighteen of Utah's largest 45 reservoirs are below 55% of available capacity. Overall statewide storage is 63% of capacity. This time last year, reservoirs were about 67% of capacity. Utahns are urged to use less water to stretch this limited resource.
