UGS geologists host media event to demonstrate landslide surveillance and monitoring



Geologists from the Utah Geological Survey (UGS) hosted the media at the Springhill Geologic Park in North Salt Lake to demonstrate and discuss landslide surveillance and monitoring. UGS monitors approximately 100 landslide locations statewide.

Once the snow melts and landslides become accessible, geologists use various tools, including stakes and GPS instruments, to monitor movement and reference historical aerial photos showing what sites have looked like over time.
