UGS paleontologists find a bonanza of fossil footprints in Canyonlands National Park



The Utah Geological Survey (UGS) is partnering with the National Park Service to inventory fossils in Canyonlands National Park. Most work has focused on the Island in the Sky District, which contains accessible Triassic-age fossil-rich rocks. As expected, we discovered fossil sites in the Chinle

Formation, but it seems that fossils are not as common here as in some other regions.

2,600 acres added to the East Canyon WMA in recent land purchase



An area that provides important habitat for deer, elk and sage grouse recently grew in size: The East Canyon Wildlife Management Area now totals 6,200 acres after more than 2,600 acres were added to the WMA after a recent land acquisition earlier this year.

Officials tour \$81 million seismic resilience project



Last week, state and local officials toured the Davis County Aqueduct seismic resilience project, a critical \$81 million effort aimed at securing the water supply for over 650,000 residents in the event of a major earthquake.

The project, funded in part by a \$24 million grant from the Utah Division of Water Resources, is being led by the Weber Basin Water Conservancy District (WBWCD). WBWCD's design team, with the help of the Utah Geological Survey and Envision Utah, identified the funding needed to upgrade the major aqueducts throughout the state.
